## Fee Remission

For the year 2017-2018, 149 students were granted remission of tuition fees (9 were granted \$87,000; 1 was granted \$69,600; 67 were granted \$58,000; 4 were granted \$52,200; 22 were granted \$46,400; 22 were granted \$34,800; 16 were granted \$23,200 and 8 were granted \$11,600). 39 were recipients of book grants and 161 received the Local Education Allowance. 74 students were granted school bursaries.

## Achievements and Reflection on Major Concern for Future Planning

### 1. *Staff capacity development in Teaching and Learning, Moral Education and Pastoral Care, Student Development*

A number of measures were adopted to further develop staff capacity in the following areas:

#### Teaching and Learning

To enhance effectiveness in teaching and learning, various measures were adopted to upgrade teaching pedagogy. Lesson observations with specific focuses were conducted within as well as across subject departments. A wider repertoire of teaching strategies, including e-learning and experiential learning, were employed to cater for learner diversity and peer interaction in the classroom. With the full implementation of e-learning across all year levels and the enhanced Wi-Fi structure and upgraded equipment, a growing readiness and confidence was seen among teachers in the use of various e-learning platforms in daily teaching as well as sharing of teaching materials. Teachers continued to attend courses on e-learning and share good practices through collaborative lesson planning.

A staff development day was arranged at the beginning of the school year to review the essence of mastery teaching and cooperative learning. Another one was held for teachers to explore the use of Google Suite for Education in teaching and learning.

#### Moral Education and Pastoral Care

Members of the Moral Education Team continued to take on an active role of supporting teachers in providing pastoral care through Form Teacher Periods. To facilitate communication with the Form Teachers, they were assigned to attend Form Committee meetings of various year levels. They shared

with the Form Teachers various strategies in conducting Form Teacher Periods and provided advice and suggestions on topics or issues that might be more difficult to address. The feedback collected from the Form Teachers revealed an increased confidence in conducting Form Teacher Periods and a growing competence in handling special issues arising in their classes.

Two staff development days with specific themes were held during the year to equip teachers with knowledge to assist them in providing pastoral care. One was a talk on growth mindset and the other was a workshop on mental health.

### *Student Development*

During the school year, teachers-in-charge of student activities were given opportunities to attend Round Square events to enrich themselves with new ideas in supporting student development in their respective areas. One teacher attended the Round Square International Conference held in Cape Town, South Africa, to explore the Round Square Discovery Framework and to network with schools from over 40 countries.

A sharing session was held for the less experienced teacher advisers of various extra-curricular activities to exchange ideas and share experiences on their administrative role and mentoring role in supervising student activities. During the session, teachers shared about their challenges and discussed ways to create a mentoring culture among students in running clubs and student bodies. Sharing sessions of different themes would be organized for specific target groups in the new school year.

## **2. *Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) Development***

To develop STEM education, teachers from Science, Mathematics, Computer and Design & Technology departments continued to collaborate closely to implement the STEM development plan. School-based curricula and learning environment were refined to promote STEM education in various forms with focus on junior forms. Robot kits and coding were introduced in D&T and Computer Literacy curricula.

In addition, STEM-related extracurricular activities were arranged to arouse students' interest in STEM. Workshops were held on enrichment programme days for Form 1 to Form 3 students. For Form 1, students learned about the programming skills to control MBOT. For Form 2, students participated in Micro:bit and coding workshops for Internet-of-Things. Form 3 students joined the "Engineer in School" programme organised by the China Light & Power Limited and attended a "One School One Engineer" talk. Students generally gave positive feedback on these activities.

With the support and guidance of our teachers, our students participated in various STEM related competitions and programmes outside school and achieved outstanding results. Our students were the Champion in the 2017 全港校際 STEM 教育發揮創意潛能大賽. One student received a Bronze medal in the Hong Kong Olympiad in Informatics 2017/18. A team of students applied various STEM skills like computer programming, 3D modelling and the knowledge of simple electrical and electronic engineering to invent a working prototype for helping the visually impaired people. They were awarded the second runner-up in the Hong Kong Student Science Project Competition 2018. Two teams of students participated in the Hong Kong GreenMech Contest 2018. They applied creativity and knowledge in science and engineering skills to design and build a Rube Goldberg machine. Two Form 1 students received a Silver Award in the 2017 Hong Kong 4D Frame Maths & Science Creativity Competition (Junior Secondary Division) and also the Gold Award in the Third International Maths and Science Creativity Competition in South Korea. In the 2018 Hong Kong 4D Frame Maths & Science Creativity Competition (Junior Secondary Division), two Form 1 students won the 4D Frame Mission Achiever Award.

To further promote STEM education among students, a STEM week was held from 16 to 20 April 2018. Dr Tong Shiu Sing from CUHK was invited to give a talk at morning assembly. Various game stalls and workshops were arranged by Science, Mathematics, Computer and D&T clubs. Outstanding student works in various STEM-related activities were displayed on the campus. On-site STEM training courses such as 3D printing, JavaScript programming and VR+Unity were organised for students who showed enthusiastic participation. Teachers also attended courses, talks or workshops related to STEM education and shared their experiences, useful resources and good practice. Useful

resources on STEM-related programmes were uploaded to school server for sharing among departments. Interfacing session with the Primary School was conducted on the development of STEM education to ensure a smooth transition both in the curriculum planning and enrichment programmes and support of individual students.

### **3. *Sustainability and development of International Connections and the Chong Yau Pak Wan Residence Hall***

The school continued to implement the strategies that had been devised for this major concern with all the staff-in-charge working hard to achieve the targets identified. These targets include enhancement of the attractiveness of SPCC exchange programmes of our sister schools and the development of potential exchange opportunities. In 2017-2018, besides hosting annual exchange programmes with our sister schools, there were new exchanges with Anglo-Chinese School (Independent) in Singapore and Chung Ling High School in Malaysia. The students and teachers from Anglo-Chinese School (Independent) were not the only overseas group to shadow our IB students and to enjoy the comfort of our Chong Yau Pak Wan Residence Hall, Bergen County Academies from the USA visited us again in November after their first visit two years ago. They too stayed in our residential hall in the evenings after shadowing our students and taking part in the preparation work of our JA company programme.

In addition to the above exchange opportunities, our students continued to participate actively in the Round Square International Conference that was held in October 2017 in South Africa. Not only did they meet and learn from their global peers and participate in a variety of activities that centred on the six pillars, I.D.E.A.L.S, of Round Square, they were also awarded the prize for Problem Solving with their innovative ideas to help rural mainland children.

### **Spiritual and Moral Education**

As a Christian college, we place a strong emphasis on nurturing the spiritual growth of our students. Through daily morning assemblies, Religious Studies lessons and Christian Fellowship programmes, the practice of Christian education is enhanced. This year, the Rev Amos Poon officiated at our Advent and Lent Services. At these services, a total of \$22,289 was collected and donated to 15 local voluntary organisations. To show our love and care to the underprivileged in our society, we collected and donated 144 gift boxes to the hearing impaired children in Lutheran School for the Deaf and Suen Mei Speech and Hearing Centre.

At Christmas, the College followed the tradition of holding our Carol Service at St John's Cathedral (for Form 2 to Form 6 students) and at St Paul's Church (for Form 1 students), with The Rev Ip Kam Fai and The Rev Vincent Chan delivering the sermon respectively; while on Ascension Day, the service was held at St John's Cathedral with The Rev Jonathan Chee delivering the sermon.

Every Wednesday at morning assembly, we were grateful to the Pastors of St John's Cathedral and St. Paul's Church for coming regularly to give sermons to us. Besides, we were particularly excited to have members from our big SPCC family, including Christian alumni and parents, to share their faith and life experience with us at the morning assembly. We invited Dr Joyce Samotou-Wong, founder of the New Sight, to give a sharing at morning assembly. Students were impressed by their testimonies and their faithful service in different sectors of the society.

The theme of the Christian Fellowship for this year was "Abundance" (豐盛的生命), This theme reminded us that if we entrusted God with our lives, we would live an abundant life because God would always prepare the best for us. Through regular gatherings, morning prayer meetings and cell group sharing, students were nurtured in Christian faith. In addition, TueStation, a religious luncheon gathering for junior form students, with the Christian parents (prayer group of PTA) providing food and the teachers giving Biblical sharing served over a hundred students. All these provided our students with a supportive environment for spiritual growth.

The Religious Week was held from 5 to 22 December, a music worship and evangelical rally was held at morning assembly. We invited Dr Chan Siu Cheuk, the Principal of Christian Zheng Sheng College, to share God's message with our students. Activities like Love Action, handicraft workshop, gospel gathering at Tuestation, and Carol Singing were held to arouse students' interest in Christianity.

The Moral Education and Pastoral Care Team organised various activities during the year. All Form 1 students participated in the School Transition and Attributes Development Programme to familiarise themselves with the SPCC Student Profile. ICAC, Department of Health, The Family Planning Association and St James' Settlement were invited to give talks and hold workshops for students on various topics such as mental health, anti-corruption, positive self-image and sex education. In addition, a series of materials under the framework of Positive Education were designed for Form Teacher Periods.

Apart from individual counselling, our three school social workers from St James' Settlement organised different developmental groups for students. Over 40 senior form students were coached through The Big Brother Big Sister Scheme to help the Form 1 students adapt to secondary school life. About 33 Form 1 and 32 Form 2 students joined the Play, Sharing, Practice (PSP) groups to enhance their coping skills and positive self-image. Activities included lunchtime gatherings and sharing, overnight camps and outdoor activities. Interpersonal relationship workshops were conducted for Form 3 classes to guide students on the management of intimate relationships. A series of seven activities were also organised throughout the year as part of the Life Connection Programmes (LCP) with a total of more than 100 participants. A service trip to an orphanage in Fujian was arranged in collaboration with Gratia during the Easter holidays, with 30 students participating in the trip.

### **Leadership and Service Learning**

During the Student Activities Week (SAW), Form 1 students enjoyed a safe and engaging outdoor learning programme with Dragonfly. Form 2 students travelled to Beijing for a language and culture immersion programme in association with the University of Hong Kong. In Form 3, we completed a successful place-based learning programme in Tai O, Yim Tin Tsai and Kuk Po in Hong Kong. In Form 4, students were engaged in a variety of Service Learning programmes with organisations such as Crossroads, The HKCCC Grace Neighbourhood Centre & Elderly Activity Centre and Methodist Epworth Village Community Centre. Two options were offered to Form 5 students with 113 of them organising their own activities, including two overseas service learning programmes to Phuket and Laos. The remaining 76 students participated in a variety of business and university attachment programmes across a diverse range of sectors.

All our junior form students completed a one-day Service Learning programme between February and March. Form 1 students took part in beach cleaning activities across several locations around Hong Kong. Form 2 students spent the day entertaining the residents at Sheng Kung Hui Western District Elderly Community Centre, St James' Settlement C&W District Elderly Community Centre, T.W.G.Hs Fong Shu Chuen District Elderly Community Centre and Yang Memorial Methodist Social Service Choi Hung Community Centre for Senior Citizens. Form 3 students worked with Saviour Lutheran and Choi Jun Schools for the mentally disabled.

Other leadership programmes were organised to meet the students' individual needs: the Nanyang Technological University Model United Nations (NTUMUN) 2018, the In-house Leadership Programmes for junior and senior students, the Prefects' Leadership Training Programme, and overseas learning trips to various places such as the US, Australia, France, Korea, Singapore, South Africa and Mainland China.

### **Rites of Passage**

This was the tenth Rites of Passage programme and involved 200 Form 3 students spending 28 days in Queensland, Australia. Spread across three residential campuses, and through a variety of experiences focused around the four key components of community living, outdoor activities, expeditions and enquiry based learning, the students were challenged physically, mentally and emotionally. Through these challenges they learned more about themselves, others and the world around them.

### **Round Square**

Round Square is a worldwide network of innovative schools in 40 countries across five continents that share a holistic philosophy of education. As a global member, our students and staff have opportunities to take part in regional and international conferences, service projects and exchanges with other Round Square schools.

A student committee within the school is tasked with developing and promoting activities that match the six IDEALS of Round Square: Internationalism, Democracy, Environmentalism, Adventure, Leadership and

Service. With student ownership of Round Square activities within the school, we have high expectations for our future involvement throughout the region and globally.

Last year, we sent one teacher and five students to attend the Round Square International Conference 2017 in Cape Town, South Africa. Two alumni speakers from the United Nations Refugee Agency and the Outward Bound Hong Kong were invited to our morning assembly to talk about the ideals of Internationalism and Adventure respectively. By working closely with the Student Union and the Environmental Protection Club, our Round Square Student Committee organised our charity Green Fashion Show featuring both teacher and student models. The Show raised over \$6000 to aid the Round Square Discovery Fund, which supports the engagement of students in international service projects such as building vital infrastructure in impoverished rural communities.

## **Language and Culture**

### Foreign Language Studies

In 2017-2018, we offered two streams of foreign language studies to students: Programme A for interest and Programme B for academic pursuit.

For Programme A, we had two German/Arabic Horsd'oeuvre classes on Fridays after school. They exposed students to the German and Arabic cultures through the learning of the languages.

For Programme B, we offered Foundation Spanish and Foundation French Levels 1-5 classes on weekdays and Saturdays. The purpose was to build up students' foundation in the two languages; thus, paving the way for foreign language studies in senior secondary and university.

Eleven students took the IGCSE Spanish Exams in May 2018 and achieved brilliant results. Three of them achieved the highest banding of A\* and another three got A.

Among the ten students who took the IGCSE French Exams, three of them achieved A\* and five of them obtained A.

### Culture Salon Activities

The theme for 2017-2018 was *Cultural Perspectives of Secondary Students* 中學生的文化眼界.

Various activities were organised to expose students to different cultural aspects through language fun event, assembly presentations and talks, cultural walk and exhibitions. To give students a taste of the German and Arabic languages and cultures, we co-organised a German/Arabic Fun event with Ms Leila, the Arabic teacher, and the School of Modern Languages & Cultures of the University of Hong Kong on 20 January 2018. The Event commenced with a brief introduction of the target languages, including alphabet, numerals and short expressions. It was followed by a session of word games and fun facts about Germany and the Arab world, their history, religious and traditional rituals, cultural festivals, scenery and famous brand names or national products. The highlight of the event was the refreshment break with typical German and Arabic beverages and delicacies.

Other culture related programmes included Hang Lung Young Architect Programme and Chung Ling International Student Camp 2018.

Enthusiasts Circles (同好小組) met irregularly for sharing among like-minded students who had similar interests in different aspects. In the past year, their interests included Rubik's Cube, Frisbee, Physics & Philosophy, Psychology and Wikipedia.



## **Aesthetics and Creativity**

### Artist-in-Residence Programme

In collaboration with the Language and Culture Working Group, the second Artist-in-Residence Programme was held from March to June 2018. Mr Samson So, a renowned photographer in Hong Kong, was invited as our guest artist. He delivered a talk about 'The Beauty of Nature' at the morning assembly and exhibited his extraordinary photos in Zhuyuetang Exhibition Gallery. The exhibition was named '絢麗非洲'. In the programme, Mr So conducted two indoor and two outdoor workshops for our students. Twenty-seven participants learned and experienced how to master key concepts and skills in photography. They also learned about respecting the nature. After the workshops, Mr So was invited to select outstanding photos from students' works. Those photos were displayed along with Mr So's exhibits at the School Gallery.

### The Odyssey of the Mind Programme 2018

The Odyssey of the Mind (OM) Hong Kong Regional Tournament was held on 3 March 2018 at The Chinese YMCA College. Seven Form 4 students took part in the competition. With the support of teachers and parents, the team was the overall champion in the division and won the Ranatra Fusca Creativity Award, besides being invited to participate in the World Finals.

The OM World Finals was held from 23 to 26 May in Iowa State University in the US. Taking part in the World Finals was definitely a fruitful experience for our students in broadening their horizons. Among 54 international teams in the division, our school ranked 6th with an Honourable Mention in the Award Ceremony.

### Hong Kong Inter-secondary Schools Advertising Design Competition 全港中學學界廣告賣橋王

Four teams of students from Form 1 to Form 5 participated in the competition which was organised by am730 and Good Morning Class. The competition had the support of The Association of Accredited Advertising Agencies of Hong Kong, The Hong Kong Advertisers Association and The Hong Kong Brand Development Council.

The competition provided an opportunity for the participants to create an advertisement for real-life companies. Both the teams from Form 3 and Form 4 won the Brand Award in their divisions.

### Exhibition

An alumna, Ms Eva Liu, was invited to hold an exhibition named 'Metamorphosis – The Evolving Reflections' at the Zhuyuetang Exhibition Gallery from November 2017 to March 2018. Ms Liu's oil paintings showcased her special artistic views on the cityscape.

### Painting Competitions

Six students from Form 1 and Form 2 participated in the '7<sup>th</sup> World Children Art Awards 2018', winning a champion award, a 2<sup>nd</sup> runner-up award and two merit awards. With these remarkable results, our school was awarded the 'WCACA' (傑出藝術教育學校). The winning paintings were exhibited in Macau, and the champion painting was nominated to compete in the '港珠澳三地青幼年美術迎新春聯展 2018', winning another champion award. Another Form 1 student participated in 'J3-J12 全港兒童繪畫比賽 2017-2018' and emerged as the champion in the Chinese Painting category.

### Other activities

On 19 October 2017, the Enrichment Programme Day, nineteen Form 4 to Form 6 students watched the drama "Confucius: 63 Revisited", performed by Chung Ying Theatre Company in Kwai Tsing Theatre.

In November 2017, six students joined the guided tour for the Standard Chartered Arts in the Park 2017 in the Victoria Park. The theme of the year was inspired by five wonderful works of world-renowned British children's writer, Roald Dahl.

In January 2018, twelve students visited the exhibition “Pixar 30 Years of Animation: Hong Kong Celebration of Friendship and Family” in the Hong Kong Heritage Museum. The exhibition featured a selection of fine artwork created with traditional and digital media, including sketches, paintings, storyboards and sculptures.

### **Extra-Curricular Activities and Enrichment Programmes**

Student-organised extra-curricular activities have always been an important component of students’ education. These activities not only allow students to join programmes of their own choice, but also enable them to learn about leadership and teamwork, as well as undergo gratifying and rewarding experiences. A list of extra-curricular activities offered is given in **Table 1**.

Our school came second for the BOCHK Bauhinia Bowl Award under the Co-educational category for 2017-2018. The award is regarded as one of the most prestigious Sports awards in Hong Kong. Thanks to all sports team members, coaches, and teachers who had devoted much of their time in training to achieve such a significant performance in all sports.

Our Swimming Gala was held on 8 September 2017 at Victoria Park Swimming Pool with Dr Lam Wing Wo, PTA Chairman, as the guest of honour for the prize presentation. Our annual Sports Day was held on 1 November 2017 at Siu Sai Wan Sports Ground with Mr. But Bronco, PTA Chairman, as the guest of honour to present the prizes.

Form 1 students were introduced to track and field events on the Athletics Activities Day on 15 January 2018. Form 2 and Form 3 students had the opportunity to try out various sports on 19 October 2017 and 19 March 2018 respectively. These sports included tenpin bowling, lawn bowls, archery, dance, hockey, golf and sports climbing.

To allow students to make better use of their summer vacation, a Summer Sports Training Programme was arranged for all students. This year’s activities included fencing, swimming, dance (hip hop), and table tennis. Intensive training was provided for members of the school teams, including basketball, badminton, volleyball, fencing, soccer, swimming and table tennis.

In the field of music, the College continues its long-standing tradition in cultivating a passion for and appreciation of this art form among all our students. Over 400 students were engaged in one or more of the many after-school musical activities on offer, ranging from choirs to orchestras, band to ensembles. Collectively, they worked tirelessly to strive for their own lofty artistic aspirations. As a part of their yearly programme, the various music teams competed in various local and international competitions. Among the many prizes and awards garnered including 2 first prizes, 3 first-runner-ups and 2 second runner-ups in the 70<sup>th</sup> Hong Kong Schools Music Festival, where the Senior Mixed Voiced Choir was also crowned the Best Secondary School Mixed Voice Choir in the choir final of the music festival, before going on to win two Gold Medals at the 10<sup>th</sup> World Choir Games, held in Tshwane, South Africa in July 2018.

The Treble Choir and School Orchestra were also invited to perform at the 2<sup>nd</sup> Shenzhen-Hong Kong-Macau Youth Cultural Exchange Arts Festival in Shenzhen and Macau respectively. The academic year came to a resounding close when all music teams gathered together in sharing their music in the Summer Concert – titled *#JAMMING!* – on 4 July 2018 in the Hong Kong City Hall Concert Hall, marking a return to this historic venue where so many of our previous editions of Summer Concert were held in generations gone by.

Enrichment programmes for all forms were organised three times in the year to further enrich students’ knowledge and experiences in different areas. Activities included talks by professionals and renowned personnel related to moral and civic education, culture, STEM education and career planning. Outings and field trips were also organised by teachers.

### **Student Union**

Being a fully-elected student body, the Student Union (SU) always upholds its commitment to the school community. Through various in-school and joint-school activities held throughout the year, the SU aims to create a flourished and diverse student life which enhances students’ sense of belonging to the SPCC family.

During this school year, the SU organised a variety of events which included the Teacher-Student Carnival, talent shows and other festive celebrations. The theme of this year's Opinion Programme held in March and April was to investigate students' work-life balance and the entire student body was actively involved in the discussion. This year, the SU also initiated a 'Stress Relief' Day in May, commencing with a talk by a guest stand-up comedian at the morning assembly, followed by a series of fun activities during lunchtime. In addition, the SU continued to work closely with the Environmental Protection Club and the Round Square Student Committee to launch our charity Green Fashion Show in April, raising over \$6000 for the Round Square Discovery Fund.

The SU also placed great emphasis on the leadership training programme, hoping to inspire and empower the youth community. The annual overnight training camp was held in November at the dormitory for SU's general committee members and class representative committee members. Through regular gatherings and activities, the SU aspired to instill into our younger students a sense of leadership and responsibility. In July, the SU cooperated with many school clubs and societies in organising the Games Day, bringing the exciting year to an end.

## Achievements of Students

### Public Examination Results

Building on the tradition of academic excellence at SPCC, both our Form 6 DSE and IB students achieved admirable results in their respective public examinations. These results reflected our students' diligence, passion for learning and pursuit for excellence. Our best achievers in the Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education (HKDSE) Examination included four perfect scorers who attained the highest achievable result of level 5\*\* in 7 subjects and six students who attained level 5\*\* in 6 subjects. Our IB cohort achieved equally impressive results with six perfect scorers attaining 45 points in the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP) Examination.

**Achievements in Extra-curricular Activities**

It was most gratifying to see many of our students winning awards and excelling in various inter-school competitions. We wish to congratulate the winners as well as all who have participated in and provided support for these competitions. ## **Enhancement of teacher professional development and personal wellness**

On 25 October 2017, an SDD was held to refresh teachers on how Mastery Teaching (MT) and Cooperative Learning (CL) work in the classroom. Some experienced teachers illustrated the essence of the two teaching pedagogies with examples. This helps departments to merge MT and CL lessons into the curriculum, and adapt the two pedagogical frameworks to the needs of SPCC students.

On 14 December 2017, Mr. Peter Tai, an alumnus, was invited to give us a talk on Positive Education. Mr. Tai provided the opportunity for us to share among ourselves, and also for us to identify areas for teachers to further develop using the Growth Mindset.

Our primary and secondary school teachers participated in a solemn and peaceful retreat in St. Paul's Church on 3 January 2018. Rev Vincent Chan officiated the service and led us through prayers for the education sector and prayers of intercession and thanksgiving. Archbishop Paul Kwong illustrated the relationship between our school and the church. His sharing reminded us of our school's history and how our school had contributed to the community. It was a fruitful afternoon of spiritual insights and understanding our roots.

In order to raise the awareness of teachers' mental well-being in the school, teachers formed small groups for sharing and discussion on issues related to school on 26 January 2018. It aimed to promote an environment of mutual support for teachers to discuss some of their professional anxieties and to encourage them to actively seek a work-life balance.

To encourage teachers to live a healthy lifestyle, physical activities were arranged for the Staff Development Day on 22 March 2018. Teachers could engage in different physical exercises including fitness training, sport climbing, badminton, yoga, basketball, table-tennis and hiking.

One of the major developments of the College is e-Learning. On 17 April 2018, Mr Jason Pang, together with his assistants, conducted a workshop on Google Suite for Education. The workshop enhanced teachers' knowledge on how to apply Google Suite in teaching and learning with hands-on exercises.

## **Involvement of Parents and Alumni**

Parents have always played an indispensable role in the holistic education for children. We are pleased to see staunch support from our parents again this year. A range of activities were organised by the Parent-Teacher Association during the year. Please refer to **Table 3** for details.
