[4.21] After the training camp, students in the group bonded better and as a result, worked better as a team. [4.17] I look forward to the training camp. [4.36] The choir garnered a First Place and a First Runner-up in the 70th Hong Kong Schools Music Festival in March, and was also crowned the Best Mixed Voice Choir of the Year in the Choir Final. It went on to win two Gold Medals in the championship classes at the 10th World Choir Games in South Africa in July.
