Fee Remission

For the year 2015-2016, 152 students were granted remission of tuition fees (3 were granted \$82,500; 3 were granted \$66,000; 84 were granted \$55,000; 1 was granted \$49,500; 26 were granted \$44,000; 17 were granted \$33,000; 11 were granted \$22,000 and 7 were granted \$11,000). Fifty-five were recipients of book grants and 191 of Local Education Allowance. Eighty-five students were granted school bursaries.

Achievements and Reflection on Major Concern for Future Planning

1. Nurturing in SPCC students a set of desirable attributes (Student Profile) for intellectual, personal, moral, spiritual and social development as a shared vision and educational goal

To nurture the set of desirable attributes (Student Profile) in our students, the schemes of work with lesson design, learning pedagogies, and assessment in each subject were revised. The past year was the first year when the implementation of a whole set of revised schemes of work from Form 1 to Form 6 in every subject was carried out. Thereafter, the revised schemes of work will be subject to a process of on-going evaluation, improvement and development.

Similarly this process of perpetual evaluation and improvement will also be conducted on the use of Self-reflection tool - an annual reflection task based on the Student Profile to guide students to reflect on their attainment of the nine student attributes through academic and non-academic experiences.

Following the display of relevant classical western paintings in the library and as screen saver in classroom computers, a new set of nine Chinese paintings, like their western counterparts, were displayed similarly in the library and classroom computers. A morning assembly on these Chinese paintings was held to help students to get a better understanding of their meaning and relation to the attributes.

To further engage students and to integrate with their learning experiences in the development of the attributes, "We in Our Eyes - Our Representations of the SPCC Student Profile" was conducted in the past year. It was an interclass multimedia competition to which each Form 1 to Form 5 class should submit at least one entry that best illustrates one of the three attributes assigned to their form. The entry had to be either the record of or a reflection inspired by a happening in the Student Activities Week (SAW). It could also be in the form of a photograph, a written quote of words from teachers, instructors or peers, an anecdote or a short video clip accompanied by a short explanation. This competition was conducted successfully resulting in a variety of presentations which were displayed in the school campus.

The final phase of the Student Profile is the Student of the Year Award to be awarded to honour a student in each year group who has exemplified the attributes of the SPCC Student Profile. The applicants are assessed by a Selection Board which shortlists the finalists to the Interview Board for making recommendation to the Principal. During this academic year, there were three recipients of this Award in recognition of their exemplary personal qualities demonstrated during their study in Form 4, Form 5 and Form 6.

2. Effective delivery of the Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education (HKDSE) Programme and the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP)

A briefing was held in December 2015 for Form 3 students and parents to introduce to them the two curricula and the range of subjects we offered. A survey on curriculum and subject preference was conducted among all Form 3 classes in January 2016 to better understand their needs and interests. Based on the information gathered from the survey, the Form 4 class structure and arrangement of subject groups were reviewed to match as closely as possible with the students' preferences. A trial allocation was done in May 2016 to further refine the arrangement. Under the new arrangement, we were able to offer a total of 42 DSE and 30 IB subject combinations. 94% of the students were allocated their most preferred DSE or IB subject combination.

With the full implementation of small group teaching for all DSE classes in 2015-2016, the average subject group size of 22 to 26 enabled teachers to cater more to the needs of individual students, enhance learning outcomes as well as create opportunities for students to grow and develop in the attributes laid out in the SPCC Student Profile. Subject panels continued to review and refine their lesson designs and teaching pedagogies for small group teaching.

Our teachers attended seminars and workshops to keep track of the ongoing review of the HKDSE curriculum and assessments so as to prepare for the implementation of the changes recommended by the Education Bureau. They also communicated their views, suggestions and feedback to the Government through surveys.

Our fifth DSE cohort achieved outstanding results in the 2016 HKDSE exams, with 63% of the students achieving level 5 or above in five or more subjects and 95.5% of them qualified for JUPAS degree courses. They received offers of admission from top local and overseas universities and many were admitted to highly competitive programmes.

Our IBDP results were equally admirable. An average of 41 out of a full points-score of 45 was obtained and 55.9% of our students score 42 or more points. These exceptional achievements allowed the Class of 2016 to receive offers

of admission from top local and overseas universities.

While we are pleased to have achieved such outstanding results, it is necessary for us to constantly assess the effectiveness of our teaching and learning for continuous improvement. This we did most rigorously in the 2015-2016 academic year in which we submitted to The International Baccalaureate our first 5-yearly review findings. This review is The International Baccalaureate's equivalent to an inspection process of formal self-reflection involving all stakeholders within the school's IB community. It has been evidence based and has drawn on existing school documentation to reflect our actual practice during the period under review. Feedback from the IB on our review findings was received at the end of the school year and we were delighted to be informed that it had not identified any matters to be addressed. Among the many strengths that have been recognised are our 'very thorough and realistic self-study' and 'the initiatives taken during the period under review for addressing the development of the Learner Profile and the promotion of international mindedness'. Our teachers have also been commended for remaining 'up to date with the requirements of the subjects in the DP' and for 'using an explicit model of teaching-learning that promoted the spirit and practice of academic honesty'. In all, the lengthy and thorough process of self-evaluation has provided us an insightful and reflective analysis as to where SPCC is in her IB development. We shall remain focused on our existing strengths and commit to continual improvement.

3. Catering for the needs and capabilities of gifted students through expansion and strengthening of personalised learning programmes

Collaborative planning of enrichment programmes, good support for gifted students, professional development for teachers to strengthen the identification of and support for gifted students, interfacing with the Primary School are incorporated into the routine work. The Gifted Education Committee serves to facilitate teachers' continual exchange of ideas and good practice in various domains. The Committee ensures close collaboration among departments on the holistic development of gifted students. Departments also review existing and explore new programmes whenever appropriate. The interfacing working groups with the Primary School ensure the early identification of and support for gifted students as well as timely report on students' progress.

There are school-based enrichment and pull-out training programmes for students to develop their talents in debating, leadership, mathematics, music, science and sports. Exceptionally gifted students can join off-site enrichment programmes through school nominations. More than 60 students joined Hong Kong Academy for Gifted Education (HKAGE) and HKU Academy for the Talented as well as off-site enrichment programmes organised by Chinese University of Hong Kong and Hong Kong University of Science and

Technology. Teachers will continue to identify suitable online courses and promote them to gifted students next year. There is ongoing communication between teachers and gifted students regarding students' development in various enrichment programmes both inside and outside school. Students' feedback on these enrichment programmes has helped teachers to further support gifted students both personally and academically.

In addition to school team training, students continue to develop their talents in Music and Sports through various enrichment programmes inside and outside school. To ensure individual students have good support and guidance, the Music and Sports Directors and teachers-in-charge maintain close communication with these students regarding their development in these areas. 14 Form 1 to Form 3 students attended the Programme for the Musically Gifted in lieu of normal music curriculum. Two gifted Music students were given special academic allowance to personalise the curriculum, allowing time for practices in preparation for auditions and performances.

In the year of 2015-16, SPCC students again achieved outstanding results in external competitions in the English language and Chinese language, debating, economics, mathematics, music, science and sports. The English and Chinese Debating Teams entered the Hong Kong Bar Association Debating Competition 2016 for the first time and both were awarded Championships of the tournament.

Easy access to records regarding students participation in school-based or off-site enrichment programmes, both in the school server and the iPortfolio of the eClass, have kept teachers updated about students' progress in various areas. Teachers also attended courses or workshops related to gifted education and shared their experiences within each department.

Spiritual and Moral Education

As a Christian college, we place a strong emphasis on nurturing the spiritual growth of our students. Through daily morning assemblies, Religious Studies lessons and Christian Fellowship programmes, the practice of Christian education is enhanced. This year, Rev Vincent Chan officiated at our Advent and Lenten Services. At these services, a total of \$13,261 was collected and donated to 12 local voluntary organisations. To show our love and care to the underprivileged in our society, we have also collected and donated 125 gift boxes to the underprivileged children in Evangel Children's Home in Hong Kong and Hechi Gratia Children Village in Guangxi.

At Christmas, the College followed the tradition of holding our Carol Service at St John's Cathedral (for Form 2 to Form 6 students) and at St Paul's Church (for Form 1 students), with the Very Rev Mathias Der and Rev Vincent Poon

delivering the sermon respectively; while on Ascension Day, the service was held at St John's Cathedral with Rev Simon Tang Yik Hong delivering the sermon. Every Wednesday at morning assembly, we were grateful to the Pastors of St Paul's Church for coming regularly to give sermons to us. Besides, we were particularly excited to have members from our big SPCC family, including Christian alumni and parents, to share their faith and life experience with us at the morning assembly. Students were impressed by their testimonies and their faithful service in different sectors of the society.

This year is the College's Centenary Anniversary, the theme of the Christian Fellowship was "For His Grace" which reminded our students to be grateful for God's grace in the past 100 years. This theme also emphasised on spreading the message of thanksgiving and appreciation in students' daily life. Through regular gatherings, morning prayer meetings and cell group sharing, students were nurtured in Christian faith. The Religious Week was held from 8 to 21 December, which included a music worship and evangelical rally in morning assembly, and activities like Barefoot Walk, handicraft workshop - "Be an angel of the others" and Carol Singing to arouse students' interest in Christianity. In addition, TueStation, a religious luncheon gathering for junior form students, with the Christian parents (prayer group of PTA) providing food and the teachers giving Biblical sharing served over a hundred students. All these provided our students with a supportive environment for spiritual growth.

The Moral Education and Pastoral Care Team organised various activities during the year. ICAC, Department of Health, The Family Planning Association and St James' Settlement were invited to give talks and hold workshops for students on various topics like mental health, anti-corruption, positive self-image and sex education. In addition, a series of materials under the framework of Positive Education have been designed for Form Teacher Periods. The school also co-operated with St James' Settlement to provide our students with career inspiration activities.

Apart from individual counselling, our three school social workers from St James' Settlement organised different developmental groups for students. A group of senior form students were coached through The Big Brother Big Sister Scheme to help the Form 1 students adapt to school life. About 41 Form 1 and 23 Form 2 students joined the Play, Sharing, Practice (PSP) groups to enhance their coping skills and positive self-image. Activities included lunchtime gatherings and sharing, overnight camps and outdoor activities. Interpersonal relationship workshops were conducted for Form 3 classes to guide students on the management of intimate relationships. A series of Life Connection Programmes (LCP) were also organised throughout the year. A service trip to an orphanage in Fujian was arranged in collaboration with Gratia during the Easter holidays, with 24 students and 1 parent participating in the trip.

Leadership and Service Learning

During the Student Activities Week (SAW), Form 1 students enjoyed a safe and engaging outdoor learning programme with Dragonfly. Form 2 students travelled to Beijing for a language and culture immersion programme in association with the University of Hong Kong. In Form 3, we completed a successful place-based learning programme in Tai O, Yim Tin Tsai and Kuk Po in Hong Kong. In Form 4, students were engaged in a variety of Service Learning programmes with schools and organisations such as Ebenezer School & Home for the Visually Impaired, Methodist Epworth Village Community Centre, and Crossroads. Two options were offered to Form 5 DSE students with 45 of them organising their own Self-Initiated Programmes and the remaining 79 participating in a variety of business and university attachment programmes across a diverse range of sectors.

Our junior forms all completed a one-day Service Learning programme between March and April. Form 1 took part in a beach cleaning activity spread across several locations around Hong Kong. Form 2 spent the day entertaining the residents at either Tung Wah Group Elderly Nursing Home or St James' Settlement Scenic Resort Nursing Home and Form 3 worked with Saviour Lutheran and Choi Jun Schools for the mentally disabled.

Various programmes were organised to suit the students' individual needs: leadership programmes such as the CheongShim International Academy Model United Nations (CSIAMUN) 2016, the In-house leadership programmes for junior and senior students, the Prefects' Leadership Training Programme, overseas learning trips to various places, including mainland China, Singapore, South Korea, Australia, France, South Africa and the US.

Rites of Passage

This was the fifth Rites of Passage programme with a full cohort of 214 Form 3 students spending 28 days in Queensland, Australia. Spread across three residential campuses, and through a variety of experiences focused around the four key components of community living, outdoor activities, expeditions and enquiry based learning, the students were challenged physically, emotionally and mentally.

Round Square

Round Square is a worldwide network of innovative schools in 40 countries across five continents that share a holistic philosophy of education. As a regional member, our students and staff have opportunities to take part in regional and international conferences, service projects and exchanges with other Round Square schools.

A student committee within the school is tasked with developing and promoting activities that match the six IDEALS of Round Square; Internationalism, Democracy, Environmentalism, Adventure, Leadership and Service. With student ownership of Round Square activities within the school, we have high expectations for our future involvement throughout the region and globally.

Language and Culture

Foreign Language Studies

In 2015-2016, we offered two streams of foreign language studies to students: Programme A for interest and Programme B for academic pursuit.

For Programme A, we had two Year 1 German/Arabic classes on Fridays after school. They exposed students to the German and Arabic cultures through learning the basics of these languages.

For Programme B, we offered Foundation Spanish and Foundation French Levels 1-4 classes on weekdays and Saturdays. The purpose was to build up students' foundation in the two languages, thus paving the way for foreign language studies in senior secondary and university.

Students took their IGCSE Spanish Exams in May 2016. They achieved brilliant results. Four out of five of them achieved the highest banding of A* with the fifth student obtaining an A grade.

Culture Salon Activities

The theme for 2015–2016 was *Cultural Perspectives of Secondary Students* 中學生的文化眼界。

Visits, outings and sharing were organised to expose students to different cultural aspects. Activities included visit to Sotheby's, tour to the Energising Kowloon East Office in Kwun Tong, visit to an architect's firm and German Fair, co-organised with the School of Modern Languages & Cultures of the University of Hong Kong. To inspire students and encourage them to leave their comfort zone and be more adventurous, we organised a series of 11 sharing sessions of "See the World" throughout the year. Teachers shared their globetrotting experience in Iran, Iraq, Syria, Siberia, Japan, India, Cambodia, and many more. The sharing was eye-opening and inspirational.

Enthusiasts Circles (同好小組) met irregularly for sharing among like-minded students who had similar interests in different aspects. In the past year, their interests included anime, magic, pokemon, tea culture, urban planning &

studies, martial arts novels, Chinese music, music, Wikipedia and Taiwan entertainment culture.

Aesthetics and Creativity

The Odyssey of the Mind Programme 2016

A team of five Form 4 and two Form 3 students took part in the Hong Kong Odyssey of the Mind (OM) Competitions in April 2016. With teachers' and past OM members' continuous support and months of training and preparation, the team was awarded the Best Performance in Spontaneous Problem and the Championship in its division among 16 teams.

As one of the winning Hong Kong teams, our team represented Hong Kong to participate in the World Finals 2016 in the US and achieved 10th place among 47 teams in the division.

Over the past 11 years in which our school has participated in the OM competitions, our students have achieved very outstanding results including three championships, two second runners-up, two Creative Awards and two Best Performance in Spontaneous Problem. This would probably be the last year that the local competition was organised by the Hong Kong Federation Youth Groups. Our students appreciated the opportunity to engage in creative problem-solving with other young people in Hong Kong and from over the world and would cherish the many fond memories they have had over the years.

Hong Kong Inter-secondary School Advertising Design Competition 全港中學學界廣告賣橋王

Three teams of students from Form 2, Form 3 and Form 4 & Form 6 participated in the competition which was organised by am730 and Good Morning Class and supported by Hong Kong Brand Development Council, Association of Accredited Advertising Agencies of Hong Kong and Hong Kong Advertisers Association.

The competition provided an opportunity for the students to create an advertisement for real-life companies. Our teams won the Brand Award in their division. The team of Form 4 & Form 6 also won the Commercial Award, the Best Storyboard Award as well as the grand prize of Overall Championship. The design created by our team of Form 3 students was adopted by the company to be used as an advertisement in the newspaper am730. The slightly modified version of the advertisement designed by Form 4 & Form 6 students was also accepted by the company for upload on the Internet.

Exhibition, talk and sharing

The Zhuyuetang Exhibition Gallery was opened this year with the first exhibition "Designing Our City" by alumni. All the exhibits were award-winning architectural projects. A student-helper group was formed and trained by our alumni architects to help set up the exhibits.

The second exhibition "Jon Sequitur" from March to June 2016 by our alumnus Mr Jonathan Mak was a collection of graphic designs including the well-known Apple logo which paid tribute to the late Mr Steve Jobs, the poster 'Coke Hands' which won Grand Prix at the Cannes Lions and Spikes Asia 2012 and the souvenirs designed by him for the centenary celebration of the College. Mr Mak also shared with us his experience in creating logos, posters, illustrations and motion graphics at a morning assembly.

A talk on "The Art of Mime" was given by the director of We Draman Group, Mr Tang Wai Kit Desmond, on the history and development of this special performing arts. Mr Tang was the first Hong Kong artist who learnt mime from the international well-known master, Mr Marcel Marceau.

Alumnus Mr Tang Ho Ming was also invited to give a performance named "The Art of Humour" at a morning assembly.

Other activities

In collaboration with the Language and Culture Working Group, an interclass multimedia competition "We in Our Eyes – Our Representations of the SPCC Student Profile" was organised. Each Form 1 to Form 5 class submitted at least one entry that best illustrated one of the three attributes inspired by a happening in Student Activity Week (SAW). The winning pieces were displayed in the School Library.

On 27 October 2015, 56 students visited two exhibitions held in the University Museum and Art Gallery of the University of Hong Kong. On 14 April 2016, 29 students visited two exhibitions held in the Run Run Shaw Creative Media Centre of the City University of Hong Kong.

Extra-Curricular Activities and Enrichment Programmes

Student-organised extra-curricular activities have always been an important component of students' education. These activities not only allow students to join programmes of their own choice, but also enable them to learn about leadership and teamwork, as well as undergo gratifying and rewarding experiences. A list of extra-curricular activities offered is given in **Table 1**.

The year 2015-2016 is a record year in sports as we have made history by being named the Champion for the BOCHK Bauhinia Bowl Award under the Co-educational category for the second consecutive year. The award is regarded as one of the most prestigious awards in Hong Kong. Thanks to all sports team members, coaches and teachers who had devoted much of their time in training to achieve such a significant performance in all sports.

Our Swimming Gala was held on 4 September 2015 at Victoria Park Swimming Pool with Dr Lam Wing Wo, PTA Vice-chairman as the guest of honour for the prize presentation. Our annual Sports Day was held on 2 December 2015 at Siu Sai Wan Sports Ground with Mrs Helena Sin, PTA Chairlady as the guest of honour to present the prizes.

Due to black rainstorm on 15 January 2016, the Form 1 track and field events on the Athletics Activities Day were cancelled. Form 3 and Form 2 students had the opportunity to try out various sports on 11 March 2016 and 14 April 2016 respectively. These sports included tenpin bowling, lawn bowls, archery, dance, hockey, golf and sports climbing.

To allow students to make better use of their summer vacation, a Summer Sports Training Programme was arranged for all students. This year's activities included basketball, fencing, squash, swimming, dance (hip hop), badminton, and table tennis. Intensive training was provided for members of the school teams, including basketball, badminton, volleyball, fencing, soccer, swimming and table tennis.

In the arena of music, our music makers continue to shine on stage. The year started off with the Wind Band claiming a Gold Award in the Winter Band Festival and the String Orchestra claiming a Silver Award in the Hong Kong Youth Music Interflows in the fall. In the 68th Hong Kong Schools Music Festival, a total of 3 first prizes, 5 second prizes and 1 third prize were won by the various music teams and ensembles.

In addition to their regular routines, the School Orchestra, Treble and Senior Mixed Voice Choirs took centre stage in the Centenary Concert held in the Hong Kong Cultural Centre Concert Hall on 14 December, where they premiered the commissioned work, A Choral Triptych: Faith, Hope and Love by Mark Hayes to critical acclaim.

Enrichment programmes for all forms were organised three times in the year to further enrich students' knowledge and experiences in different areas. Activities included talks by professionals and renowned personnel related to moral and civic education, culture, science, environmental protection and health education. Outings and field trips were also organised by teachers.

Student Union

Entering into the centenary year of the College, the Student Union (SU) worked collaboratively with the school community and the Alumni Association and took part in various celebratory events. The Open Days in October was the first official event in which the Student Union helped with the decoration of the school campus, which featured a big birthday cake at the main entrance, bringing all schoolmates and visitors a festive and joyous atmosphere. To assist the Alumni Association, the SU also took charge of co-ordinating over 100 student helpers during the Centenary Gala Dinner in December. The memorable year ended with the Student Union's participation as the Uniform Catwalk models during the Spectacular in July.

Apart from the centenary events, the SU also put in a lot of effort to create a more flourished and diverse student life which enhanced students' sense of belonging to the SPCC family. For instance, the SU organised a variety of events including the Stationery Megasale, the Teacher-Student Carnival, talent shows and other festive celebrations. In addition, the theme of this year's Opinion Programme was to investigate students' views on the IT-facilitated learning and the use of tablets in class. Thoughtful discussions were held in focus group meetings and the programme allowed students' voices to be heard.

The SU placed great emphasis on the leadership training programme, hoping to inspire and empower the younger generation. In addition, the annual overnight training camp was held at the dormitory for its committee members and class representatives. Through regular gatherings and activities, the SU aspired to instill in youngsters a sense of leadership and responsibility.

Achievements of Students

Public Examination Results

Building on the tradition of academic excellence at SPCC, both our Form 6 DSE and IB students achieved admirable results in their respective public examinations. These results reflected our students' diligence, passion for learning and pursuit of excellence. Our best achiever in the Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education (HKDSE) Examination attained the highest achievable result of level 5** in 7 subjects. Other top scorers included four DSE students who attained level 5** in 6 subjects in the HKDSE Examination and eight IB students who achieved a near perfect score of 44 points in the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP) Examination.

Achievements in Extra-curricular Activities

It was most gratifying to see many of our students winning awards and excelling in various inter-school competitions. We wish to congratulate the winners as well as all who have participated and provided support in these

competitions. The trophies and recognition are a reflection of the high morale among our students, the commitment of teachers and participants, and the generous funding from the College. For a list of student achievements, please refer to *Achievers*.

Enhancement of teacher professional development and personal wellness

The first Staff Development Day (SDD) was held on 26 August 2015 on Positive Education. Positive Education focuses on specific skills that assist students to strengthen their relationships, build positive emotions, enhance personal resilience, promote mindfulness, and encourage a healthy lifestyle. Our teachers were introduced to the concepts and practice of Positive Education, its importance in the school's curriculum and how it can be applied in teaching and learning at SPCC. On 25 November 2015, we invited Mr Charlie Scudamore, vice-principal of Geelong Grammar School, Australia, to share his first-hand experience of implementing Positive Education in his school.

On 15 October 2015, a group of 7 facilitators from St John Ambulance gave talk on "Introduction to First Aid". The talk introduced the basic principles of First Aid, and allowed room to further pursue our First Aid knowledge and skills.

To promote eLearning in school, we held a SDD on 28 January 2016, inviting Mr Li Ka Wah, a seconded teacher to EDB, to share his experience of using electronic devices in the classrooms, including the use of student response system to create an interactive and fun learning environment. He also suggested practical ways to have better classroom management when using tablets in classroom.

Representatives from English, Mathematics and Science Departments shared their knowledge and experience of using tablets in the classroom on 7 April 2016. They introduced a range of teaching and learning strategies used in lessons.

Mr Chan Kai Tai, a physiotherapist and an alumnus, gave us a talk on "Common Problems and Basic Care on neck, shoulders and knees" on 4 May 2016. He introduced ways to alleviate body pains through appropriate exercises and daily practice. Feedback from the participants is encouraging.

Involvement of Parents and Alumni

Parents have always played an indispensable role in a holistic education for children. We are pleased to see staunch support from our parents again

this year. A range of activities have been organised by the Parent-Teacher Association during the year. Please refer to **Table 2** for details.

Our wholehearted gratitude goes to our alumni for their enthusiastic support and contribution to the development of the College. The Alumni Association has been going from strength to strength, helping to foster the bonding among our graduates over the decades. **Table 3** is a summary of their activities last year.

Donations to Charitable Causes and Fund-raising Campaign

Being a Christian school, we have always attached great importance to caring and sharing. On the Dress Special Day on 8 October 2015, we raised a total of \$71,648 for the Community Chest. On 23 October 2015, 69 staff members and students donated blood to the Hong Kong Red Cross Society. Twice in the year, we collected donations from our students and staff to be distributed to the following charitable organisations:

Hong Kong Sheng Kung Hui Welfare Council Limited, St John's Cathedral, Hong Kong Red Cross, Cedar Fund, The Society for the Relief of Disabled Children, St Jame's Settlement, Against Child Abuse, Joyful (Mental Health) Foundation, The Samaritan Befrienders Hong Kong, Oxfam Hong Kong and Children's Cancer Foundation.

The Council of St. Paul's Co-educational College Charitable Trust organised its annual Walkathon at The Peak on 8 November 2015. With the enthusiastic support of parents, staff, alumni and students, a record high of \$3.3 million was raised.

Centenary Celebrations

The year-long celebrations of the School's Centenary was widely applauded a great success. The Kick-Off Ceremony took place at the Tree Court on 3 October 2015. It included the Time Capsule dedication ceremony, musical performances at the School Hall, and a preview tour of the newly established Heritage and Development Trail that covers the Archive Gallery, Exhibition Gallery, and the Music and Sports Complexes. More than 10,000 guests came to the Open Days of the Secondary and Primary Schools that took place on the two consecutive weekends in October.

The Most Rev Dr Paul Kwong presided over the Centenary Thanksgiving Service and Dedication of the School Campus and Chapel on 30 November. It was followed by the Centenary Concert which featured the choral and orchestral groups from both the Primary and Secondary Schools as well

as the Alumni Choir, playing to a full house at the Cultural Centre on 14 December.

Then came the Gala Dinner on 20 December, which was the School's largest ever celebration dinner with 3,500 guests seated in the two halls in the Old Wing and the New Wing of the Hong Kong Convention and Exhibition Centre.

The Centenary Celebrations ended on a high note with 2,000 students, staff and alumni participating in the Spectacular at the AsiaWorld-Expo on 9 July 2016, providing joyful and memorable moments for members of the SPCC family.

The Centenary Year was also marked by the publication of the Centenary Book, a newspaper supplement and feature stories in the mainstream newspapers, as well as a series of highly popular Centenary Souvenirs.

Appreciation

The Centenary Year not only marked a milestone in the School's history, but also provided a platform to involve all members of the SPCC family through the various celebratory events. It reconnected St Paulians across different generations and from around the world and further enhanced the bonding among students and teachers.

The Centenary Celebrations would not have been so successful if not for the leadership of the Council, in particular Council Chairman Dr Moses Cheng, Chairman of the Centenary Celebration Committee Mr Chien Lee, the Alumni Association and our supportive parents.

The Centenary Year was a time of celebrations as much as a time of thankfulness. We thank our founders at St Paul's Church of the Sheng Kung Hui for their vision for equality in education; we thank our predecessors and teachers for their hard work and dedication to building the School and nurturing a wealth of talent throughout the years; we thank the generation after generation of St Paulians for their contributions to Hong Kong in the last century. We are proud, we are grateful, we have been blessed all these years.

While the School enters its second century, we shall continue our education mission and our legacy of nurturing the leaders of tomorrow. We shall remain an anchor and a beacon to our students in the name of and for the glory of God.

We have had another rewarding year in 2015-2016 where our brilliant students made noteworthy records in different areas. While challenging themselves to achieve their goals, our all-rounded students continue to grow with the SPCC attributes – being optimistic, inquisitive and responsible.

Three Primary Five students, Lam Chi Kin Alistair, Lee Wing Hay and Tsui Yee Hong, were appointed the Flying Dragon Ambassadors in the 28th Junior Dragon Ambassador Election and participated in the Asian Pacific Children Convention held in Fukuoka, Japan.

Languages and music remained the areas where our students excel. They gave outstanding performances in the 67th Hong Kong Schools Speech Festival and the 68th Music Festival, winning 90 championships in various solo speech and music events. Both the Upper Primary English Choral Speaking Team and the Lower Primary Putonghua Choral Speaking Team snatched the Championship. Our Intermediate Choir was proudly awarded two prizes: The Best Primary School Intermediate Choir of the Year and The Most Outstanding Primary School Choir of the Year in the Hong Kong Region and the Kowloon Region.

Primary Two student Chu Priscilla Lorraine and Primary Six student Ho Pak Fung deserved special recognition with their achievements in the Hong Kong Young Writers Award Competition, where they were awarded winners in the Non-fiction and Fiction categories respectively. The Radio Drama Team won the Gold Award in the 8th English Radio Drama Competition for Schools in Hong Kong & Macau. Primary Six students Ho Pak Fung and Yu Lok Hei won the first prize in the 4.23 World Book Day Creative Competition.

Our students' talent was not confined to languages and music. They achieved outstanding competition results in sports as well. In the 2015-2016 All Hong Kong Inter-Primary School Sports Awards, the girls' team won the Gold Award and the boys' team won the Silver Award. Individually, Primary Six Student Patricia Hui was the champion in the All Hong Kong Schools Jing Ying Table Tennis Tournament Girls' Singles, and the Schools Interport Hong Kong & Macau Table Tennis Competition.

We are also pleased to have witnessed our students' accomplishments in the areas of STEM. Primary Five student Gao Hong Ye successfully entered the Junior Space Camp Programme in the USA and was appointed the Junior Astronaut. Primary Five student Lam Chi Kin Alistair won the Golden Award in the China Adolescents Science and Technology Innovation Contest. Primary Five student Chu Cheuk Hei was the Overall Champion and awarded Star of the Game in Grade 5 in the 2016 Asia International Mathematical Olympiad Open.

On top of these, Primary Six student Tse Chloe won the first prize in the category of Imaginative Drawing in the 31st China Adolescents Science and Technology Invention Contest.
