The Treble Choir from St. Paul's Co-educational College won the Grand Prix in the 14th Busan

**Choral Festival & Competition 2018** 

The 60-member choir swept four top awards with works by Hong Kong composers

HONG KONG, 24 Oct 2018 - The Treble Choir from St. Paul's Co-educational College - consisting of

choristers aged 13 to 16 - participated in the four-day festival in Busan, South Korea from October

17 to 20. Presented by the Korea Choral Institute, the festival played host to 50 choirs from around

the world this year, in a city that embraces the arts.

Taking treasured time away from their busy academic studies, the students competed in two

categories: Youth Choir (for aged 18 and under) and Classical Equal Voices (open to all ages) where

there were 10 and 12 participating choirs respectively. Under the direction of conductor Anne Chu

On Lai, they presented two thoughtfully curated and richly varied programmes which included

two commissioned works by Hong Kong composers, Gershom Tse and Warren Lee, both alumni of

the College. The five-member international jury, chaired by Dr. Anton Armstrong from the United

States, unanimously awarded them the Gold Prize in both categories.

As a double winner of their categories, they went on to compete in the Grand Prix Final against

winners of other categories; among them, three semi-professional choirs from Poland, Latvia and

Indonesia, regions renowned for their choral tradition. By far the youngest ensemble in this

prestigious event, these young singers were unfazed by the spotlight and gave a most heartfelt

performance of Tse's song, "Pilgrim" (客旅), one that defied their tender age and won the

audiences and jury over yet again.

As winner of the Grand Prix, the Treble Choir of St. Paul's Co-educational College was awarded a

total prize of US\$20,000. Conductor Anne Chu On Lai, a full-time music teacher at the College, also

garnered the Best Conductor Award at the ceremony. Under her wings, these 60 bright young

students have assumed custody of the College's culture of excellence and rich musical tradition,

as well as their roles as Hong Kong's cultural ambassadors.
